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## **Course Syllabus**

# Japanese: Intercultural Communication 15 Credits\*, Second Cycle

#### Learning Outcomes

On completion of the course, students will be able to:

- discuss basic concepts, conceptual frameworks, and broader contexts of intercultural communication
- analyse and discuss examples of cross-cultural conflicts in a variety of situations (applying them specifically but not limited to cases involving Japan)
- identify barriers to effective intercultural communication
- display intercultural sensitivity in terms of beliefs, values, and norms
- problematise the concept of intercultural competence.

#### **Course Content**

The course focuses on fundamental, conceptual, and practical dimensions of intercultural communication in everyday life that includes social, business and media-driven contexts. Various examples of social interaction in multicultural environments, focusing especially on the Japanese context, will be analysed and discussed in order to develop students<sup>4</sup> intellectual appreciation for cultural differences and sensitivity regarding intercultural interaction.

#### Assessment

- Active participation in seminars
- Written assignments
- Paper
- Oral presentation of the paper

#### Forms of Study

Obligatory seminars. The languages of instruction are English and Japanese.

#### Grades

The Swedish grades A–F.

The final grade for the course is based on an overall assessment by the examiner.
