

Course Syllabus

Chinese: Chinese Society 7.5 Credits*, First Cycle

Learning Outcomes

On completion of the course, students will be able to:

- discuss emerging trends in modern Chinese society (from 1912 to the present)
- discuss a selection of given themes from different perspectives
- reflect on and argue for their own interpretations of emerging trends in modern Chinese society
- collect, compile and analyse information in relation to a theme that is relevant to the course.

Course Content

The course provides a broad overview of China's changing society from different perspectives and introduces themes that highlight developments in Chinese society from 1912 until today. Focus is on the changing social climate. A selection of representative academic texts in both English and Chinese will be discussed, and the content is put in relation to important socio-cultural phenomena such as gender, communication, education and language.

Assessment

Continuous assessment of oral presentations and written assignments.

Obligatory seminars. The languages of instruction are Chinese and English.
